

**Gerald Groenewald** is an associate professor in and former head of the Department of History at the University of Johannesburg. His primary research focus is on the seventeenth and eighteenth-century Cape Colony within its wider transoceanic context. He has published widely on topics ranging from slavery, gender and family history to the social and economic history of early modern Cape Town. He is also interested in the rise of Afrikaner nationalism in the early twentieth century, as well as aspects of the history of the Afrikaans language. Formerly editor-in-chief of *Historia*, the journal of the Historical Association of South Africa, and an associate editor of *Gender Questions*, he currently serves on the editorial boards of several scholarly journals.
